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EMSIV Project

"Empowerment of ethnic Minority Students In Vietnam"

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The EMSIV project, coordinated by AlmaLaurea, is intended to promote a comprehensive dialogue on ethnic minorities in higher education in Vietnam by enhancing the networking among national stakeholders in order to promote their commitment for a successful inclusion of ethnic minority students into the labour market. EMSIV project specifically aims at analyzing the self-perception of Vietnamese minority students when they enter the labour market as well as the attitude of firms towards minority graduates and at apprehending the employment situation and characteristics of ethnic minority graduates. Such activities are compounded by capacity transfer in favour of beneficiary universities' staff so to foster the employability of students belonging to ethnic minority with EU partners sharing their strategies and tools developed in the field of protection, empowerment and inclusion of ethnic minorities.

## Specific objectives

- To appraise labour market dynamics for etnnic minority students
- To appraise ethnic minority graduates' employment situation
- To enrich beneficiary universities knowledge on EU best practices on ethnic minority protection, empowerment and inclusion, as well as students' employability tools
- To strengthen ethnic minority students' knowledge on employability tools
- To raise the awareness of Vietnamese policy makers and firms on ethnic minority students' needs
- To promote networking for a permanent dialogue among all interested Vietnamese stakeholders on ethnic minority students' employability

## Expected results

- Release of a report on ethnic minority graduates tracking
- Publication of a recommendation paper for enhancing minority students' employability
- Drafting of a policy brief raise their awareness on the issue of ethnic minority students' inclusion into the labour market
- Signature of a memorandum of understanding with firms for internships of minority students
- Creation of a permanent forum on ethnic minority youth



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
